→ Canada will need over 800,000 long-term care beds by year 2047 – over 2.5 times what we have now.



→ 6,000 additional long-term care facilities need to be built over the next 35 years. That's almost 170 new facilities per year.

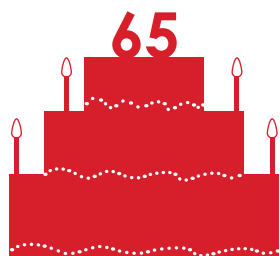
→ Senior healthcare was projected to total \$84.3 billion in 2010.

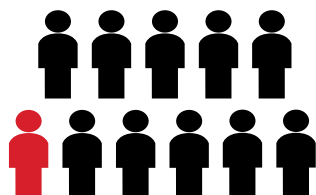


→ 225,000 Canadians turn 65 each year<sup>1</sup>

→ Approximately 7% of seniors aged 65+ reside in health care institutions<sup>1</sup>

→ 160,000 full-time nurses & PSWs and 70,000 part time as of 2006<sup>3</sup>

→ Resident care employees work 467.7 million hours yearly<sup>2</sup>



→ 1 in 11, over age 65, are affected by Alzheimer's disease or related dementia<sup>1</sup> with \$3.9 billion spent each year<sup>4</sup>
